

SPORT ACTIVITY AND HIS ROLE IN REPRESENTING DELINQUENT CHILDREN THE RULES AND SOCIAL SYSTEM

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***ABSTRACT_** This study aimed to identify the effectiveness of a football training program in the assimilation of social norms and regulations by delinquent children in the Tamara Child Protection Center near Rabat, Morocco. This study was applied to a sample of 30 delinquent children with difficulties in self-control and subsistence. The sample was divided into two groups: the proposed program was applied to the experimental group of 15 children; And the control group that included 15 children as well. The suggested training program was applied to the first group, while the physical education program - programmed into the program of sports activities in child protection centers - was applied to the latter group. The results demonstrated significant differences between the two groups in favor of the experimental group that joined the proposed program. One of the main recommendations in the light of the results achieved; This program is included in the platform for physical education, sports in activation programs for delinquent children; With difficulties in autonomous skills; Due to its positive impact on the performance competencies identified in this study.*
